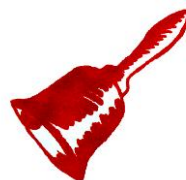

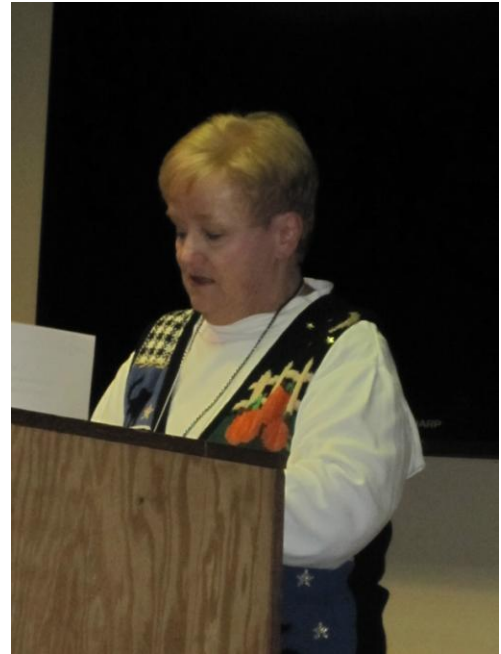
THANKS FOR YOUR GREENS ORDER!

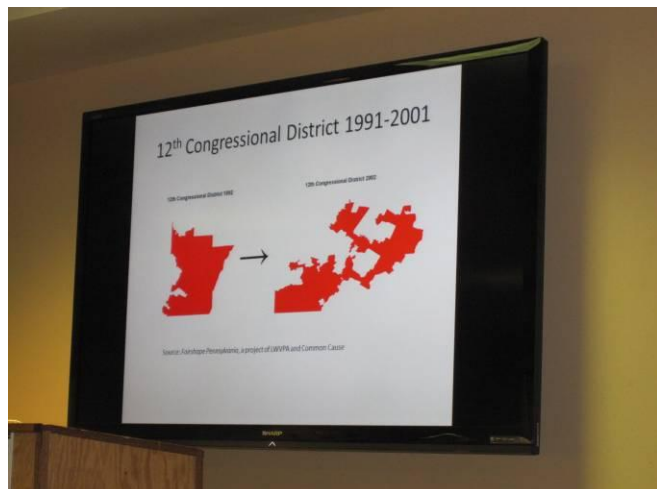
