The AAUW-PA 87th Annual Meeting was held at the Chateau Resort and Convention Center in Tannersville from April 15 to 17. Having grown up in nearby Stroudsburg, I remembered this place as the old Camelback Ski Resort. It was fun to reconnect with many of the AAUW members I've met in the last 33 years. I consider myself fortunate to have attended every state convention since 1983.

Some of the convention highlights included listening to Heather Mason, LAF litigant, who shared the story of her gender discrimination lawsuit which AAUW LAF funds helped her settle. Another highlight was Dr. Catherine Hill's presentation of her latest report – "Barriers and Bias: The Status of Women in Leadership" which AAUW launched on March 30, 2016 at the Newseum in DC. Giving to AAUW Funds supports all AAUW research. Dr. Hill said that future research topics include student debt, more STEM, diversity and the wage gap. Keynote speaker Cordy Galligan, AAUW VP of Marketing and Business Dev., lighted up the room with her suggestions of how to market our branches. Cordy introduced the new 6-minute AAUW video "One AAUW: Changing the Climate for Women and Girls." It would be great to show this video at our September Branch Meeting.


Convention business included re-election of President Dot McLane and Program Vice President Sandy Homel for second terms, passing bylaws changes, and introduction of a Branch Handbook that is chockfull of useful information for use by all members. AAUW North Hills Pittsburgh sent entries for three branch awards: Gateway to Equity – presented to Girls of Steel at our April 18th branch meeting, Outstanding Woman and Member Making a Difference awards (both of which will be announced at our May 18th dinner). 17 branches honored Gateway to Equity persons or groups; 26 Outstanding Woman were announced; and 21 branches honored Members Making a Difference. The wine basket our branch prepared for the LAF Basket raffle made \$80. Thanks again to everyone who contributed to the basket and to Mary Eury for her beautiful assembly.

And what about the fun? It was fun to watch the four La Roche students (whom Peggy Schmiedecke drove to convention) interact with some of us old-timers and the other e-SAFs from Pitt and Lock Haven University. Way to go Alaya Rhymer for being part of the Student Advisory Council presentation! I had great fun portraying AAUW Founder Marion Talbot in a reader's theater along with six members who portrayed Marion's family and friends. The script is available for our use. And lastly, I certainly had fun sharing news from our branch during meals and especially during the Saturday night dessert social.


