The Bookers of the Evening will convene February 16, at the home of Ann Carlson at 7:30. Peggy Schmiedecke will review 5 Days at Memorial: Life and Death in a Storm-Ravaged Hospital by Sheri Fink. Dr. Anna Pou – did she murder 4 patients at New Orleans' Memorial Medical Center during Hurricane Katrina? There will never be a satisfactory answer to that question or many others raised by the 45 bodies found in the debris strewn medical center. Sheri Fink interviewed more than 500 participants and her gripping narrative captures the facts of the situation as well as the thoughts of her witnesses to that period of disorder, confusion and tragedy. (NYTimes) The Bookers also will be attending a Drue Heinz lecture March 2 by Sheri Fink. Sina Murphy has a few extra tickets if you are interested.
