Tech Savvy – May 14, 2016 at La Roche College

The Curriculum Committee Co-Chairs which include Dr. Susan Banerjee and Peggy Schmiedecke have been working hard and have accomplished a lot in the last 45 days. We hosted two meetings with the four La Roche College professors who committed to conducting workshops. We solidified what they will do in their workshop and confirmed that they would deliver each session twice. One of the workshops was changed to being an engineering and design challenge that would be completed by all the girls and adults with a competitive twist – The Last Tower Standing. This change opened a workshop slot. At the College Success Forum held on 2-2-16 Peggy did double duty presenting Tech Savvy at a session which resulted in networking to start getting the word out about Tech Savvy. This lead to an opportunity to open a discussion with her Junior Achievement (JA) contacts regarding Tech Savvy. JA has STEM programs for middle school students and they are very interested in exploring a partnership with AAUW – stay tuned.

We are thrilled that Susan was able to confirm on 2-3-16 another pending workshop with her contacts at Girls of Steel! They agreed that they would be a workshop provider; this fulfills our Robotics STEM topic.

Additionally on 2-3-16 Dr. Kate Silvis (one the La Roche professors working with us) conducted an Act 48 session about STEM with middle school teachers and she promoted our upcoming conference.

We are working diligently to get the draft schedule (included in Viewpoints) confirmed. Once it is confirmed it goes to AAUW National for final approval, and this leads to the development of the online registration form that AAUW National will create for us. The plan is to have this form on our website by or before March 1st. This will help us to move forward with marketing the conference. In the meantime, Peggy has begun reaching out and emailing principles and guidance counselors for the 9th grade girls. In the next two weeks, emails will go to the $6 - 8^{th}$ grade middle schools. Things are happening!
