But on August 18, 1920, the 19th Amendment to the Constitution was finally ratified, enfranchising all American women and declaring for the first time that they, like men, deserve all the rights and responsibilities of citizens.

# **Child and Parent Place at Anchorpoint**

Anchorpoint Counseling Ministry recently announced plans for the Child and Parent Place at Anchorpoint (C.A.P.P.), a community mental wellness and education center specialized in serving children, teens and parents. The purpose of C.A.P.P. is to address and prevent increasing rates of childhood anxiety and depression in our communities and in our schools. Led by licensed and experienced child and family counselors and certified educators, C.A.P.P. will feature outpatient counseling (including play therapy, parent counseling and family therapy), K-12 tutoring/mentoring and parent/youth seminars and workshops. These services will be available to local youth and families of all faiths and backgrounds, regardless of insurance or ability to pay.

- 1. To support facility renovations for C.A.P.P. in Fall 2020, Anchorpoint needs volunteers to assist with basic organizing and moving tasks during daytime hours on weekdays in mid-August and late-September.

# **Public Policy Activities**

Here are several ways you can be involved in public policy activities regarding family leave, human trafficking, dating violence and pay equity this quarter. These issues affect us or people we know and care about. Learn, stand up, speak out and make a difference! Encourage others to do likewise!

#### Support proposed Pennsylvania Family Care Act SB580

AAUW supports this bipartisan bill. Please contact Senator Lindsey Williams (38th district) who serves on the Labor and Industry Committee to support the bill. To do so: call her local office at 412-364-0469 or her Harrisburg office at 717-787-8625 or email her through her website at senatorlindseywilliams.com. Per the Senator's website, if you do not live in her district, she will share any message she receives with your senator.

In formulating your comments about the bill, consider:

Unlike most developed countries, the United States does not guarantee paid parental leave or paid time off from employment to care for family members. Women are especially affected by this policy, and face continuing economic disadvantage from it in terms of lost wages, being forced into premature return to work. An AAUW survey showed that paid family leave is the benefit workers most need or want. Therefore, AAUW supports the Family Care Act (SB580), a bipartisan bill that is currently before the Pennsylvania Legislature.

The bill is important because most Pennsylvanians do not have access to paid family and medical leave insurance. The Family Care Act would remedy this situation by establishing a state-wide fund administered by the Department of Labor and Industry and would give workers the ability to invest small payroll deductions — only about 50 cents for every \$100 — so that they could take advantage of benefits at times of family health emergencies instead of losing their jobs. Paid family leave makes sense for women, men, children and families. It means that employed adults can be at home to care for and bond with new babies or adopted children and share caregiving responsibilities for seriously ill or disabled family members. Employers will benefit through increased employee retention and lower costs associated with employee turnover.



# **Fun Facts About Leap Year**

A leap year is any year with 366 days instead of the usual 365 days. Therefore, *leap day* in 2020 will fall on Saturday, February 29th.

So... why the extra day?

It was the ancient Egyptians who first figured out that <u>the solar year and</u> <u>the calendar year didn't always match up.</u>

That's because it actually takes the Earth a little longer than a year to travel around the Sun - 365 days, 5 hours, 48 minutes, and 46 seconds, to be exact.

The Romans first designated February 29 as leap day, but a more precise formula (still in use today) was adopted in the 16th century when the Gregorian calendar fine-tuned the calculations to include a leap day in years only divisible by four - 2012, 2016, 2020, 2024, etc.

**Leap Day 2020:** In 2020, leap year lines happen to perfectly line up the major holidays so that Valentine's Day lands on date night Friday and Cinco de Mayo lands on (Taco) Tuesday. Christmas 2020 and New Year's Day 2021 are also on a Friday, meaning a leisurely 3-day weekend to kick off both.
